

94% of college freshmen from the class of 2020 persisted to their second year. Nationally, 60% of low-income students drop out at this point.




Student Loans Taken

90% of Scholars took \$5,000 or less in student loans. 83% of all Scholars took \$0 in student loans.




College Graduates






